Six classes of bone based on shape • Long-humerus, radius, tibia • Short-cube shaped bones, carpal & tarsal • Flat-sternum, ribs,parietal • Irregular-odd shapes, bones of the face and vertebrae • Suture-small bones filling in the space between skull bones • Sesamoid-patella
